The Mariners' Awarded Rotary District Grant for Discovery Project

NEWPORT NEWS, Va—The Mariners' Museum and Park has been awarded a Rotary Foundation District Grant of \$24,750. The grant will provide upgrades to create a welcoming outdoor space for children ages two through five in Mariners' Park. The Discovery Project reflects The Mariners' commitment to the school-aged child and efforts to promote a new generation of environmental stewards.

"Funding will allow The Mariners' to complete vital renovations to improve the Lil Mariners' Play Zone, create our first designated early childhood education program location, and encourage children of all abilities to engage in nature through play," said Grant Writer Josi Washington. "This generous funding was made possible by the leading effort of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point who, along with five local clubs, came together to secure support for the Discovery Project."

Along with improvements to Lil' Mariners' Play Zone, the project also includes upgrades to the current Bumblebee Learning Garden and installation of a new outdoor learning space with modular seating. These enhancements will allow Museum educators to host interactive programs in a nature-based setting and provide an immersive experience for exploring native flowers, pollinators, and Park animals. Rotary Club members will be assisting with physical improvements during the project.



The Mariners' Museum and Park connects people to the world's waters because through the water — through our shared maritime heritage — we are connected to one another. The organization is an educational, private 501(c)(3) nonprofit institution accredited by the American Alliance of Museums and preserves and interprets maritime history through an international collection of ship models, figureheads, paintings, and other maritime artifacts. The Mariners' Museum is home to the USS *Monitor* Center, and is surrounded by the 550-acre Mariners' Park, the largest privately owned and maintained park that is free and open to the public in North America. The Mariners' Museum Library is the largest maritime library in the Western hemisphere.
